Models for Equipping your Congregation for Evangelism

Jesus' final commandment to us was to **"Go!"** We call it the **Great Commission**. We call it **Evangelism**. It's the centerpiece of our work because it is the essential piece that allows us to continue to **disciple** and **multiply**.

This resource serves to get you started as you equip your congregation. **The Billy Graham Center,** in partnership with **Lifeway Research,** the **Caskey Center for Church Excellence and eleven other denominations** underwent a study of small churches (attendance up to 250) to find out the key factors that predict **growth through conversion.**

The top reason churches grow through conversion is, "the church attracts and keeps a higher percentage of unchurched attendees. These churches are places of invitation, welcome, and involvement for the unchurched. So, the unchurched stick around in greater numbers. They come to Christ and get committed to the church in greater numbers."
